1 Doorstep criminals active in Folkestone and Dover

Reports from the Lynwood area of Folkestone of a driveway & patio company cold calling and pushing to start work straight away.

In Dover, cold callers were knocking on doors offering to tarmac potholes and patch driveways. One resident expected to pay a couple of hundred pounds for the work but the criminals demanded tens of thousands.

Doorstep criminals (also known as rogue traders, cowboy builders, building and gardening scammers) cold call on unsuspecting households offering convincing deals to try to get you to agree to having work carried out. We know that if you accept work from a doorstep criminal you'll pay much more than you intended for very poor, unnecessary and sometimes dangerous work.

X Never respond to cold callers! <u>Request a free NO COLD CALLERS door sticker</u>.

✓ If you need work done on your home or garden use a safe, local trader that's been vetted by <u>Kent Trading Standards</u>.

E Look out for others, report active doorstep criminals to Kent Police on 101. You can also report it to the charity CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111. You'll stay 100% anonymous, always.

Match out for scams relating to the Household Support Fund (HSF)

The Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) are warning that fraudsters are attempting to pose as processors for applications for HSF, and are requesting a sum of "refundable" monies to process applications within a short period.

The scam appears to duplicate the 'Funded by UK Government' logo, and communications have come from an inbox titled "HSFAaplications", with the email address 'hsfaaplications@gmail.com'.

The use of non-official email addresses or inboxes, and the spelling issues within the name of both, are tell-tale signs of a scam.

▲ The Food Standards Agency (FSA) has updated advice on the risk to children of glycerol in slush ice drinks, based on an assessment showing a risk to children under the age of seven.

The FSA say "'We expect industry to share data on the quantity of glycerol in their products to inform our future work. Meanwhile, there are immediate actions they can take that can help protect children and reduce the risk from these products. For example, retailers should limit cup sizes and should not offer free refill promotions to children under 10.'

▲ Pieminister Kitchens recalls various Pieminister pies because of incorrect use-by dates.

The products have been labelled with use-by 24 June 2026 instead of use-by 24 June 2025. The products are therefore not safe to eat beyond their intended use-by of 24 June this year.
