Dear Kent Residents

You may of seen in the news this week that up to £10 million worth of suspected counterfeit toys that could contain toxic materials and choking hazards have been seized by Trading Standards in what they say is one of their biggest ever raids.

Kent Trading Standards recently supported this multi-agency enforcement visit to a number of premises in London.

Intelligence suggested that these locations were involved in the supply of alleged counterfeit or unsafe goods, including distribution to businesses in Kent. Additionally, there was intelligence indicating that these locations were the destination points for several suspicious imports through the Port of Dover.

Clive Phillips, Operations Manager for Kent Trading Standards commented: "This operation highlights the importance of collaborative efforts in tackling the distribution of counterfeit and unsafe goods. By working together, we can better protect businesses and consumers in Kent from the risks associated with these illegal activities."

Be careful where you purchase them. Every year we receive reports of online websites selling fake flight tickets targeting Kent residents.

The scam works where you buy a ticket online from an unofficial ticket portal only to find when you get to the airport there is no record of your ticket purchase and unable to get a refund.

⚠ Mobile Phone Upgrade Scam

Residents are cold called and offered discounted handset upgrades or new contracts. Once they provide their online mobile account details, criminals place orders with genuine companies but ship different handsets to the residents' address. The criminal then instructs the resident to return the handsets to an address or get a courier to collect, leaving the resident liable for the new contracts.

- Be very cautious about any cold callers

⚠ PayPal Email Scam Alert

You get an email impersonating PayPal saying that an unauthorised transaction was made using your PayPal account. It tells you to call a number to receive a refund.

- This is a scam attempting to steal money and financial data from you.

⚠ We have received reports of doorstep criminals active in Kent, offering gardening work

Residents are cold called and pressured into agreeing the work. The costs escalate, the work is minimal and the criminals keep coming back to demand more payment.

One resident had their life savings stolen, whilst another paid many thousands of pounds. The criminals also burnt commercial waste in the garden.

- Doorstep criminals (also known as rogue traders, cowboy builders, building and gardening scammers) cold call on unsuspecting households offering convincing deals to try to get you to agree to having work carried out. We know that if you accept work from a doorstep criminal you'll pay much more than you intended for very poor, unnecessary and sometimes dangerous work.
- Never respond to cold callers! Request a free NO COLD CALLERS door sticker here
- ✓ If you need work done on your home or garden use a safe, local trader from Kent Trading Standards Checked.
- Look out for others, report active doorstep criminals to Kent Police on 101. You can also report it to the charity CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111. You'll stay 100% anonymous, always.
